Athletics: NCAA-III intercollegiate teams include men's baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, soccer, tennis; women's basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, volleyball; intramural sports; cheerleading; Dazzlers Dance Team; Huntingdon First Marching Band

Technology: A laptop computer is provided for each student for use all four years, his or hers to keep upon graduation.

Travel: Travel opportunities during the junior or senior year are offered either at no additional cost or for modest fees.
