Huntingdon's tuition is a bargain among national liberal arts colleges, while our class sizes, student-to-faculty ratio, and placement rates are among the best in the country. Recognized as one of the "Best Southeastern Colleges" by the Princeton Review, Huntingdon provides a number of benefits to full-time day students as part of the **Huntingdon Plan**, including a personal laptop computer (yours to keep upon graduation), Levelized Tuition, international travel opportunities during your junior or senior year, personalized advising, and an outstanding liberal arts education. In short, Huntingdon provides an invaluable education at a real value.

Huntingdon administers more than \$18 million annually in the form of grants, loans, scholarships, and work-study, benefitting 100% of our students. This assistance comes from College, federal, state, private, and community sources.

LEVELIZED TUITION FAQ

Huntingdon's Levelized Tuition plan—the only one of its kind in the region—is designed to alleviate the pressure of rising tuition costs.

- 1. What is "levelized tuition?"** Levelized Tuition means your tuition cost will remain the same during four years of consecutive full-time enrollment, allowing your family to budget for college costs without the worry of future tuition price increases.
- 2. Will my federal aid package change from year to year?** Because of changes in federal and state aid requirements and in you and your family's financial situations, your aid package may change each year. However, as long as you maintain consecutive full-time enrollment, your tuition will not increase, and as long as you meet the requirements for any Huntingdon tuition scholarships and grants in your aid package, these awards should not change.
- 3. Does levelization include the cost of room and board?** No, room and board costs are subject to inflationary changes.
- 4. How does levelized tuition affect transfer students?** Transfer students will pay the same tuition and fees as entering first-year students and will share in the benefits of Levelized Tuition during their course of study.

ADMISSION AND FINANCIAL AID CHECKLIST

- Apply for admission to Huntingdon College. You may apply online at www.huntingdon.edu or by calling (800) 763-0313 or (334) 833-4497 to receive information by mail.
- Request that your official high school/college transcripts be sent to the Office of Admission.
- Have your ACT/SAT scores sent to the Office of Admission (if scores are not on your transcript)
- Apply for a Personal Identification Number (PIN) for yourself and, if you are a dependent student, ask that your parents apply for a separate PIN, at www.pin.ed.gov. This will allow you and your parents to apply for financial aid online.
- Complete the 2011-12 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov as soon as possible after January 1. The Huntingdon Title IV code is 001019.
- Explore local financial aid sources with your high school, community, church, or employers. Last year, Huntingdon students received more than \$600,000 in funding through outside sources.
- Check out no-cost Internet scholarship search engines, such as www.scholarshipexperts.com and www.fastweb.com. In general, Huntingdon discourages the use of scholarship services that require fees.

Note: Only degree-seeking students are eligible for financial aid. Huntingdon scholarships and grants cannot be combined and cannot be offered after a student enrolls, but federal and state aid may be added to student awards.
