### EDUCATION IN THE METHODIST TRADITION

*“For wisdom will enter your heart, and knowledge will be pleasant to your soul.”—Proverbs 2:10*

Huntingdon College, a four-year liberal arts college of the United Methodist Church located in Montgomery, Ala., seeks to instill in students a love for life-long learning. The College motto, “Enter to grow in wisdom, go forth to apply wisdom in service,” is engraved above the door of the College’s oldest building, John Jefferson Flowers Hall.

United Methodist higher education, in the tradition set forth by John Wesley, strives to be accessible to all who harbor a desire to learn and to grow in wisdom and service. To that end, Huntingdon offers several United Methodist scholarships and grants to make a great college education affordable to all Methodist youth.

### CROSS & FLAME GRANT

The half-tuition Cross & Flame Grant is awarded to full-time day students who are active members (for a period of at least one year prior to the first day of enrollment) of the United Methodist Church, the African Methodist Episcopal (AME) Church, the African Methodist Episcopal Zion (AME Zion) Church, or the Christian Methodist (CME) Church. The grant is renewable for up to three additional years of study (some restrictions may apply) and generally cannot be combined with other Huntingdon College scholarships or grants. Entering first-year or transfer students are eligible for this grant.

### TRIPLE YOUR DOLLARS FOR SCHOLARS

The United Methodist Higher Education Foundation (UMHEF) will provide a \$1,000 matching scholarship to eligible applicants on a first come, first served basis. This scholarship is matched two ways: by the sponsoring church, who must remit a check payable to UMHEF for \$1,000 with a completed application form; and by Huntingdon College, through the Cross & Flame Grant or other equivalent

scholarship. Candidates must be enrolled or enrolling as full-time students in a United Methodist-related college, university, or seminary, and be active members of the UMC for at least one year. ### UNITED METHODIST LEADERSHIP SCHOLARS

The United Methodist Leadership Scholars (UMLS) program, initiated by the 2004 Jurisdictional Conference of the Southeastern Jurisdiction (SEJ) and select United Methodist-related higher education institutions in the SEJ, is designed to encourage college-bound, active United Methodist students to attend United Methodist-related colleges or universities by offering up to \$2,000 in additional scholarship funds. ### UNITED METHODIST SCHOLARSHIP & LOAN FUND

The United Methodist Church, through the General Board of Higher Education and Ministry, offers scholarships to full-time United Methodist students. Applications are available from the General Board in Nashville, Tenn. In addition, the United Methodist Student Loan fund, the oldest student loan fund in America, loans up to \$5,000 per calendar year at 5% interest.
